Whilst November ushers in shorter days, the autumn and winter bring their own joys - the beautiful colours of an autumnal woodland; the sight of a dark, starry sky on a clear night. Unfortunately I've failed miserably to spot the aurora that's been reported! Winter is also the time of year to plant trees and hedges. We will be planting 2km of new hedgerow around Staffordshire thanks to funding from national **CPRE's Hedgerow Heroes** project. I'm pleased to welcome Claire Geoghegan to the team as our new Hedgerow Heroes project manager. With over 20 years' experience working in environmental conservation, community development and habitat preservation projects around the world, she will be a great asset to CPRE. We have also received funding from the county council's Climate Action Fund which will be used to plant hedgerow on National Trust land in Kinver. We're grateful to Cllr Victoria Wilson for her help with this.

Our popular stargazing night at Beaudesert will be back in February. Thanks to Keele Observatory and funding from the Cannock Chase AONB Partnership, children and young people from Scouting and Girlguiding units will once again get the chance to look through powerful telescopes and learn more about stars and constellations.

The stargazing night is just one of the ways in which we're reaching out to young people. We will be encouraging schools who have previously won our Green Schools Trophy to take part in the Green Tree Badge scheme, which aims to get 1 million school-aged children to take part in tree-based activities.

I'd also like to take this opportunity to congratulate the village of Edingale, the winners of CPRE Staffordshire's Sustainable and Green Initiatives Award in the Best Kept Village Community competition. They've installed solar panels on their village hall, are mowing verges less often to encourage wildlife and attract pollinators, and are

working with other groups to monitor water quality in the River Mease.

Thank you to everyone who attended our AGM in August, held in the delightful surroundings of Ingestre Orangery. Next year's AGM will see a return to Blithfield Hall (the venue for the 2012) AGM) on 7th September. I'm pleased to welcome Chris Emsley as our new treasurer. I'd also like to take this opportunity to thank Steve Anderson and Anna Woolliscroft, who have stepped down as trustees, for their dedication to CPRE Staffordshire.

Welcome to the CPRE Staffordshire Hedgerow Heroes Project



Earlier this year, CPRE Staffordshire was named as one of nine successful CPRE groups chosen to take part in the national 'Hedgerow Heroes' campaign. Now in its third year, 'Hedgerow Heroes' is an ambitious project that aims to plant, restore and regenerate hedgerows across a range of landscapes, whilst encouraging local communities to reconnect with nature and participate in activities that improve local biodiversity.

Why focus on hedgerows?

Hedgerows are an iconic and beloved feature of our countryside that provide a wealth of hidden benefits that not only support our health and wellbeing, but that of our wider environment. When managed sensitively, a network of connected and healthy hedgerows provides safe

habitat, passage, food and breeding resources for some of our most vulnerable wildlife species, with studies conducted in 2015 counting 2,070 species in just one 85m stretch.

Hedgerows also help to mitigate the impact of climate-related events by storing carbon, reducing air and water pollution, and preventing soil and wind erosion during times of flooding and drought. These benefits are particularly valuable to the 70% of UK land under agricultural use, where the presence of hedgerows not only provides food and shelter for livestock, but helps to increase the presence of pollinators and reduce the risk of disease and pests that impact upon the success of arable farming.

In short, hedgerows not only form part of our countryside heritage, but are essential to secure the future of our natural environment, our food and our health. It is therefore devastating to know that over 50% of all UK hedgerows have been lost in the last 75 years, with the remaining fragments at increased risk of damage, decay and disease.

What can we do to help in Staffordshire?

The Hedgerow Heroes project provides us with an exciting opportunity to support the future of hedgerows in Staffordshire. Together, we aim to plant and restore over 2km of hedgerow (that's 10,000 plants) at multiple sites around the county, including in urban areas, public spaces, wildlife reserves and agricultural landscapes.

This project also provides us with wonderful opportunities to help communities engage with their local environments and help protect and improve our countryside, as well as our collective health and wellbeing.

How can I help?

Join our enthusiastic and friendly team of Hedgerow Heroes!

Whether you're passionate about planting (no experience necessary), wonderful with words, art or photography, an inspirational educator, or fabulous at making cups of tea, we need you! We have a range of volunteering opportunities available within the project, and are seeking supporters to help with the practical,

social, publicity, digital, educational and wellbeing aspects of the project.

In return you will have the opportunity to learn new skills, meet like-minded people, make a positive difference to our local hedgerows and have the support and guidance of our team.

CPRE NATIONAL NEWS

CPRE's newly-launched
2023 Local Green Spaces
(LGS) report shows that
there has been an
increase in LGS
designations, but deprived
communities remain
under-served.
LGSs were introduced in
2012 to give Green Beltlike protections to smaller

areas of land that are often identified by communities themselves. Since then, 7,286 LGS have been designated in total, for reasons including their recreational value, beauty and importance for wildlife. The report reveals that LGS designations have increased by 771 since 2022, most of them in northern England. In London, the total number of LGSs grew by 64%. However, mapping reveals a persistently strong correlation between deprivation and lack of green space. CPRE is therefore calling for a standardised designation process to make it easier for communities to make use of the legislation.

The four key pillars of CPRE's manifesto for the next General Election are rural affordable housing, enhancing Green Belts, rooftop renewables, and a land use framework fit for net zero.

The results of CPRE's inaugural 'Hedgelife Help Out' survey have now been published. More than

2,000 people reporting back on hedgerow height, connectivity, blossom, the wildlife they found and more, as well as how the experience made them feel.

LOCAL PLANNING ROUND-UP

Stafford Borough Council



Outline Planning Application for the erection of 36 dwellings (Use Class C3) including 32 Affordable Units, 4 Custom/ Self-Build Plots: Access, Layout and Landscaping with the Matters of Appearance and Scale Reserved. We objected to this application on a greenfield site at the edge of Stafford, close to Cannock Chase AONB (see picture above). A previous very similar

application was previously refused.

Lichfield District Council

We responded to the online survey on development plans for Curborough Brooks, a large development of around 2,900 houses on greenfield land near Lichfield. A full outline planning application will be submitted in the autumn.






