## A BIT ABOUT US

We've been standing up for Staffordshire's countryside for over 85 years. Today, we keep a watching brief on planning applications and respond to Local Plan consultations and offer advice to community groups who are fighting proposals for inappropriate development in their area.

We've also organised a 'health-check' of the Staffordshire Way, free stargazing nights for children, Green Clean events to press for the introduction of a Deposit Return Scheme to reduce littering, and have planted trees and hedges around the county. We run an annual awards scheme for conservation and environmental work by schools.

We couldn't do all of this without our talented team of volunteers.

Whatever your background and experience, the duties of all of our Trustees include giving strategic direction to the organisation, setting overall policy, defining goals, setting targets and evaluating performance. As a trustee, you will be mostly homebased, carrying out activities around your other commitments. As a guide, we anticipate this voluntary role will require on average 3 hours per week. This includes attendance at about six committee meetings per year and the Annual General Meeting. All meetings either have a hybrid option or are fully online.

If you have a strong interest in the countryside and the ability to work as a team member with a group of committed volunteers, we'd love to hear from you.

We invite expressions of interest from individuals of all backgrounds and we're especially keen to increase the diversity of our Board.
